ABOUT CHAIDUAR COLLEGE



Chaiduar College has carved niche in the history of Assam that posterity will cherish in the days to come. Although the place owes its name primarily to strategic geographical location having six routes of entry from the adjoining hilly places, it attains significance because of its existence in conjunction with the place Gohpur, which has been made the Sub-Divisional Headquarter in the District of Biswanath, Assam. To address the necessity of higher education in this large area stretching from Buroi to Hawajan, the college with Arts Stream, affiliated to Gauhati University, Guwahati, was set up in 1967 with all out support and co-operation from a few humble citizens in particular, and neighbouring populace in general. The college was subsequently placed under deficit Grants-In-Aid by Govt. of Assam in 1977. Giving further boost to the direction of higher studies, the Science Stream was given a decent start in 1987, and was placed under deficit grant-in-aid in 1998.



Realizing the ever growing need as felt in higher education, the college introduced a few Career Oriented and Computer courses in 2006, and the much needed Commerce Stream in 2012. Alongside this, the college is running handful of courses under the supervision of the Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) as partner institute. In addition, our college has the privilege of successfully running two skill based B.Voc. (2015) courses and some other courses under the IDOL – Gauhati University. Doing all this, what is sought to achieve is a genuine hub of teaching-learning environment that is all conducive to students and well-wishers alike.

NAAC Accreditation and Ratings

Chaiduar College was accredited by NAAC for the first time in 2005 and was awarded a C⁺⁺ grade. The college was reaccruited in 2010 and was awarded B grade (CGPA 2.68) grade points. Again the college has been reaccruited in November 27, 2017 and graded B⁺⁺ (CGPA 2.82) on seven point scale.

Academic and Learning Environment at CHAIDUAR COLLEGE

Chaiduar College offers a high quality of academic and learning environment in an inter-disciplinary setting as prescribed under the NEP. The College has a good teacher-student ratio of about 1:20 with highly dedicated, enthusiastic, skilled and experienced faculty members. Original documents will be verified after online admission once it is felt by the college. Offline submission of application form will not be allowed at any circumstance. There is no cost involved in the admission process as per the announcement made by the Govt. of Assam.

RESERVATION CRITERIA

The institute follows all reservation rules of the govt. of Assam. Besides govt.'s reservation rules it follows following reservation norms:

- ↳ 3 percent of the total seats in each faculty (Arts and Science) will be kept reserved for differently abled candidates.
- ↳ One seat is kept reserved in each department for son/daughter of employees of this college.
- ↳ Only five seats will be kept reserved for the candidates with co-curricular and extracurricular proficiency both in Higher Secondary and Degree Classes.

All candidates seeking admission under any Reservation Quota for disabled/son/daughter of the permanent employee of the college or extra-curricular and co-curricular activities have to produce certificates from respective authority along with the admission form.

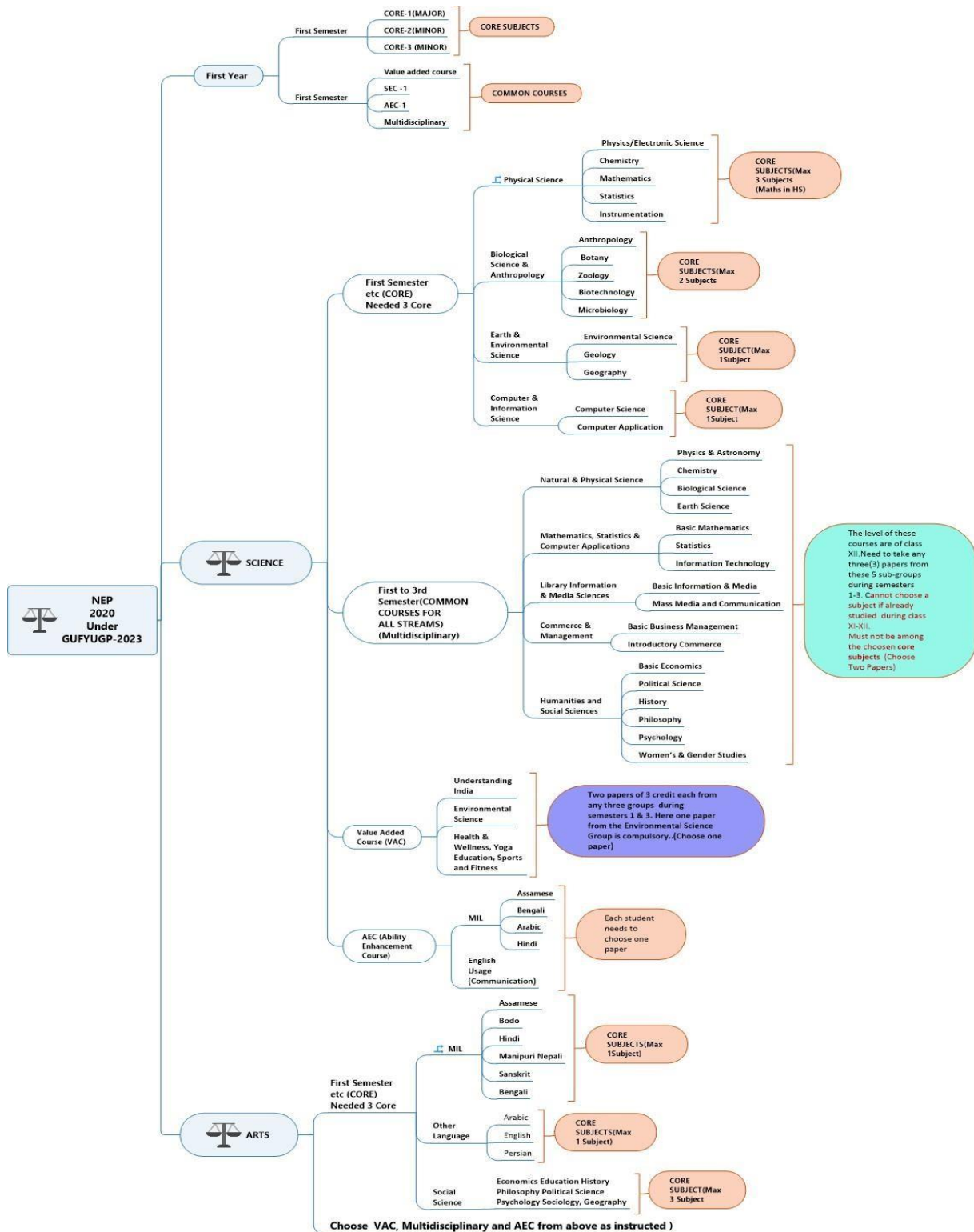

INFRASTRUCTURE AT CHAIDUAR COLLEGE

CENTRAL LIBRARY:

The college library possesses quality resources in all the subjects/fields related to the present courses offered in the college. The total stock is almost 29000 books with subscription to several periodicals, journals and daily newspapers. The collection for each subject reflects the special interests and need of the teachers as well as students. The library is equipped with a modern reading room with an updated reference section.



The library is open from 10.00 a.m to 4.00 p.m on all working days except Sunday and Govt. holidays. A library card is issued to every student. Honours students will get two books at a time. Regular Students one book and H.S. students one book at a time. A student is not allowed to keep a book for more than fifteen days from the date of issue, failing to which the student will be liable for penalty .However students will be allowed to reissue the books for another 15 days on demand. Moreover, each department has arranged for its own departmental library to provide the necessary booksfor the poor and the needy students on loan basis. A Xerox machine is installed in front of the library for providing photocopies of different articles papers at minimum rate.

Classrooms

Healthy, clean, spacious and airy classrooms are provided by the college show that students can give full attention and concentration in the class-room teaching learning situation.



LABORATORIES:

The college has well equipped laboratories in the Department of Botany, Chemistry, Education, Physics, Zoology and, MLT.



Computer Centre

The College has three computer labs having a total of 50 computers equipped with updated software and hardware along with high-speed internet connectivity and uninterrupted power backup. The computer labs are also installed

This magazine basically emphasizes on literary flair and designing graphics of students in Assamese, English language. There is also a college wall magazine, a student unions' wall magazine along with the wall magazines maintained by all the departments in the college to offer opportunities for the development of the creative talent of the students.



EXCURSION AND FIELD TOUR:

Field Study Tours are organised by some departments as part of their curriculum. Apart from this, many departments have also organised departmental level picnics and educational tours.. The students of the college also go for excursion to different places of the country regularly.

PHOTOCOPYING FACILITY:

For the greater interests of the students and teachers and other staffs of the institute, photocopying facility is made available in front of the Central Library at a nominal rate. This facility is also offered to the external visitors of the library.

INDOOR STADIUM & GYMNASIUM:

The College has a multipurpose state-of-the-art Indoor stadium and a well equipped with two badminton courts and two table tennis boards. The college has a modern gymnasium for the use of students furnished with modern fitness equipment's. It helps the students to maintain their physical fitness.



Auditorium

The college has a modern and spacious auditorium with multimedia facilities for all kinds of cultural and academic functions. Hostel Accommodation for Girls and Boys

The college has a hostel for Girls which can accommodate about 85 students. The selection of boarders is made on merit cum distance basis. The hostel is named as “*Kanaklata Girl’ Hostel*”. The boarders participate in all sorts of cultural functions as a representator of the hostel.

From the Academic Session, hostel facility is provided to as many as thirty boys as on merit cum distance basis. The hostel has been built under the initiatives of the Dept. of WPTBC, Govt. of Assam.

4th Physics Olympiad organized by Assam Physical Society was conducted at Chaiduar college on 8th November.



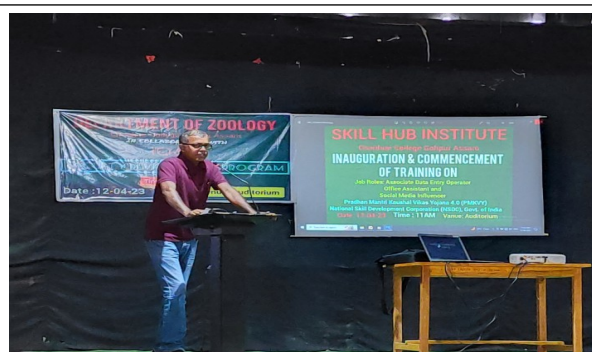
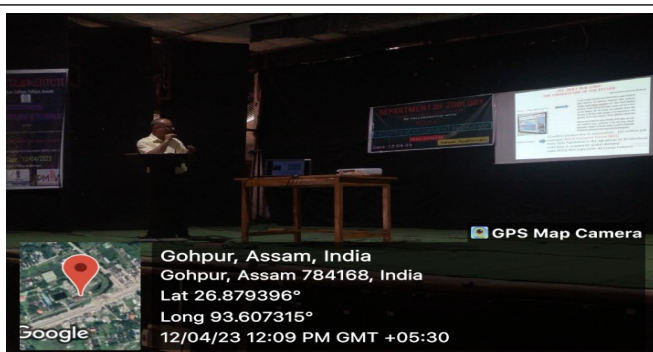
Student interaction and Felicitation programme of the Best Graduate 2021 was organised by the Department of Physics, Chaiduar College on 24th December.
